

Internships Available for BISC Students for Spring 2024

General description of the internship course, BISC 4986:

The internship available are unpaid internships for which the students may receive academic credit. Students will receive up to 3 credits in the spring by signing up for BISC 4986. **BISC 4986 would count as a BISC elective course.** Applicants will go through a selection process. The selection will be based on seniority and how this internship may benefit the student's career after graduation. **Students will be asked to meet with the internship (BISC 4986) director two times per semester and provide a supervisor evaluation form at the end of the semester.** Each student is required to do an oral presentation and write a reflection paper. **Some of the internships may be applied toward the MCC ESSV2 requirement.**

Health Policy Internships

Organization: An Internship with Citizen Action of Wisconsin

The Citizen Action of Wisconsin is founded in 1983 as a community/labor coalition. Citizen Action of Wisconsin is dedicated to economic, racial, and environmental justice, and achieving a Wisconsin and an America where every human being has an equal opportunity to live a meaningful and fulfilling life. We are working to set up an internship with two of their teams, the Health Justice and Health Care teams. This internship may count towards the MCC ESSV2 requirement. Internship title: Health Equity Internship:

This internship is with the CAW Health Justice Team and its campaign to advance health equity in the city of Milwaukee. Across the country, health care provider chains have tried to reduce or eliminate core health care services or close hospital facilities in lower-income minority neighborhoods. Milwaukee is no exception, with hospitals seeking to pull back from such neighborhoods. The intern will work with the CAW Health Justice Team to survey North Side residents on the services they need and expect from health care providers and to hold such hospital systems accountable to provide those services to neighborhood residents.

Qualifications for both internships:

- BISC students who have junior or senior standing.
- Possession of good social skills, ability to listen to others, and to be open and willing to learn from people with diverse backgrounds.
- Interns will provide their own transportation to the Citizen Action Wisconsin location on 47th and Vliet in the near west side neighborhood. CAW is also accessible by city bus.

Timeline:

Applications due: Rolling application. It will close when an intern is selected.

Internship length: 1/18/24 through 5/7/24

General Time Commitment: 8-10 hours per week. The time is flexible. The intern organizes the time with the supervisor.
